Paschal Candle

A brief note on the Paschal Candle. Some of you may have noticed that the Paschal Candle has moved to a position near the altar. During the season of Easter, the Paschal candle is positioned near the altar for the 50 days of Easter. After Pentecost, the candle is returned to its usual place near the baptismal font. The tradition is that (where feasible) the candle will burn continuously throughout the season. Because that is not feasible in our case, we light the candle early for service, and extinguish it after most people have left. Unapproved Immanuel Lutheran Church Council Minutes April 2022

The April 4, 2022 meeting of the Immanuel Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. with Pastor B. Wachendorf providing the Opening Prayer. J. Voyles noted that changes needed to be made to the agenda before it can be approved. We need to eliminate all the items under Old Business for they were managed last month and add a discussion about COVID restrictions. He also asked to add to New Business discussing the agenda of the upcoming special meeting. P. Otte moved to approve the April Agenda as amended with these specific items. J. Hall seconded the motion. Motion carried.

P. Otte shared a devotional reading based on Romans 15:5-7. B. Wood will share devotions in May.

A draft of the secretary's minutes had been emailed to the council members, published in the Parish Patter, and printed for tonight. J. Hall brought forth several changes to be made to the minutes. P. Otte moved to accept the minutes as corrected. J. Hall seconded. Motion carried.

In the Treasurer's report, D. Meier presented verbal highlights to the printed report. This is the first report prepared by L. Johnson of Abbott & Associates, and it uses the same format that D. Meier had used previously. The boiler fund is now being used for air conditioning donations. The transition has gone well, and the new process is working well. J. Hall moved to approve the Treasurer's Report, and B. Wood seconded it. Motion carried. J. Voyles noted that Abbott sent a contract that needs his signature even though it has J. Hall's name on it. Abbott charges \$550/month for services and reports. P. Ruch asked if the contract is annual, but per J. Voyles it's open ended

In the President's report, J. Voyles announced that P. Burge is stepping down as Church Secretary to take a full time position elsewhere. She is giving about a four week notice and is willing to help train someone. We have a couple of names to contact, but if those do not provide a person to take the part time secretarial position, we will advertise for help. A congratulatory farewell celebration was discussed.

Committee Reports:

Publicity: (vacant council position) Patty has been doing publicity for Holy Week. Since we do not have anyone officially doing publicity, all Council Members need to keep our ears open. An email came from the synod office looking for community involvement outreach that synod churches are doing currently to be submitted to Living Lutheran magazine. J. Voyles has spoken with D. Campbell regarding putting together an article about what the Outreach Committee is doing with Food for Thought.

Board of Stewardship: J. Hall presented the written report from the Legacy Committee's March 20, 2022 meeting during which Treasurer A. Lessen reported a balance of \$7,016 in the Legacy Fund. They discussed the application for a \$3000 grant for The Dolly Parton's Imagination Library for Logan

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County administered by the United Way of Logan County. After some discussion, D. Sydney moved to grant \$1,500 for the administration of a Dolly Parton Imagination Library. A. Lesson seconded the motion, and the motion carried with a request for the United Way to follow up with the Legacy Committee with a report of the progress of the project. P. Ruch moved to approve J. Hall's Board of Stewardship Report. P. Otte seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Board of Maintenance: (vacant council position) J. Hall, acting reporter, presented a written report with verbal highlights. The written report notes a discussion related to the boiler system, waiting for B. Triplett to submit a contract for regular maintenance of the system, and his inspecting the air conditioning system. J. Ireland is working with P. Ruch to fill the cracks in the parking lot, and in the council meeting, P. Ruch noted he has purchased supplies.

B. Conrady will check on the noise emanating from the water cooler in the Parish Hall. L. Richert has replaced all of the exterior lights with LED and energy saving lights and fixtures with the help of J. Ireland and B. Conrady. Les and Theresa Richert donated all of the materials for these lighting projects. A special thanks to all! With the new lights in the circular stained glass windows over the entries, R. Hall is planning to install plexiglass protection very soon. R. Hall will check the gutter guards for the north side of the church, and he reviewed the impending sale/transfer of property. A report from C. Strampp was related to the exterior boiler room door in need of attention. He agreed to get an estimate from Bee's Landscaping for an estimate on finishing the rock in that muddy area. J. Hall reported to council that Shawna Watkins, indoor custodian, has resigned her position with ILC. The Maintenance Committee is searching for a replacement, however, in the meantime, members will have to do basic cleaning in the interim. Also, Please note: If any group is meeting, please clean up after yourselves due to this gap in housekeeping services especially now.

Parish Education: Barb Wood stated we are continuing with Sunday morning discussions. They get interesting!

Women of Immanuel: Norma Knollenberg was unable to join us tonight, but the WOI did serve for the conference meeting and, per Pastor, did an excellent job.

Outreach: (vacant council position) J. Voyles provided a print report with some verbal highlights. ILC's two bingo sets were missing some of their marbles, so a new set has been purchased. The partial sets will be eliminated. Food Pantry is collecting pasta and sauce in April, complete pancake mix and syrup in May, and boxed foods in June. Food for Thought deliveries are scheduled through the month of May. The Moms Who Care report included a Facebook post: *Moms Who Care had 6th graders at LJHS on Thurs-day, March 17. There were 19 students who came in to shop, and 6th graders know how to shop. They get all the necessary items to get them by: deodorant, lotions, shampoo, shower geel, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and ChapStick. They also stock up on folders, spiral notebooks, highlighters, and pencils. Socks are also very popular. A teacher had asked us about getting a new pair of tennis shoes for a student. We got her a new pair of Nike shoes in the color she wanted–black! The smile on her face when she saw them and then put them on was priceless!! Then she picked out a new pair of socks and gave us a hug and walked proudly back to class. This is why we do what we do!! A list of items wanted for donations was included along with a thank you to donors. L. Smith continues to enjoy managing the card ministry. The group further discussed the third White Elephant Bingo night.*

Worship & Music: P. Ruch noted that the group has not met since the last council meeting but will meet tomorrow. Attendance: Ash Wednesday, 12:30 p.m.: 10, 7:00 p.m., 23; Wednesday Lenten Services, 24; Saturday worship, 22; Sunday worship, 29.

In his report, Pastor noted 7 visits, 7 calls, 1 baptism, and 1 funeral. He has also been busy with working on preparations for Holy Week services and weekly Lenten Services. He hosted the monthly conference meeting and attended the weekly First Call Meeting. It was the first time they had met in person! He attended weekly conference lectionary study, attended Bishop's monthly forum, and led Immanuel's Sunday lectionary study group. He wants to specifically thank Shirley Klink and Glenda Downing for their excellent musical assistance with the weekly Lenten services!

In Old Business, the council discussed COVID restrictions. We have already made masks optional, and the council would like to remove other restrictions on seating, hand shaking, and the communion process. There has not been communion at the rail since before Pastor came to Immanuel! A discussion of current statistics and possibilities ensued. J. Voyles asked if we can say we will remove these restrictions, but the council will revisit the topic and follow LCHD guidelines every council meeting. P. Ruch said the idea is to keep spacing in the pews and do a preparatory for Pastor run of Maundy Thursday communion at the rail. There was a brief discussion of protocols. P. Ruch moved to proceed with communion at the rail, no longer socially distanced pew seating, passing of the peace with handshakes, eliminating signage for the tub of pens beginning on Easter morning with the protocols to be reviewed monthly. J. Hall seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

In New Business, Council discussed the agenda for the Special Congregational Meeting to take place on May 1, 2022 to discuss and vote on the property dispositions of the two parcels of land. A ballot will be needed, and J. Voyles wants to verify what the two parcels are being called for the sake of consistency and clarity. Discussed the odd shape of the property behind the parsonage due to LCHS needing Miller drive. Council will be asking all congregation members to submit questions regarding transfer and sale of property. There were no motions, only informal agreements.

At 8:00 p.m. P. Otte moved to adjourn the meeting, and J. Hall seconded the motion. Motion carried, and all present stood to join hands and pray the Lord's Prayer.

National Day of Prayer is Thursday, May 5th. Public prayer will be held from 12 to 1 p.m. in the rotunda of the Logan County Courthouse.




